

Alleged catcaller turns himself in

An 84-year-old man recently turned himself in after allegedly harassing a lone female pedestrian through the rolled down window of his vehicle, according to Clinton County Court documents.

Marvin M. Freed, 84, of 396 Smulton Drive, Rebersburg, was charged with misdemeanor lewd or threatening harassment for a March 9, 2018, incident, which allegedly occurred in broad daylight, court records state.

Freed allegedly pulled his 2003 Ford Taurus over beside the female victim walking alone along the 600 Block of West Church Street, Lock Haven. Freed harassed the victim through the rolled down window of his vehicle, according to the affidavit filed by Lock Haven City Police arresting officer Paul Gramley.

"The male driver told her he saw her walking and thought she was beautiful and asked her [to get] in his car and told her he would show her a good time," Gramley wrote in his affidavit.

The incident ended when the victim began recording it on her cellphone, according to court documents.

"As soon as she told the male he was being recorded he drove off quickly," Gramley's affidavit states.

An arrest warrant was issued the day of the March 9, 2018, incident, and Freed turned himself into Clinton County Police on March 11, 2018, according to court documents. Freed was released on bail, court records state.

Freed's preliminary hearing will be held before Lock Haven Magisterial District Judge Keith G. Kibbler on March 20, 2018.
